- ORGANIZATIONAL CHANGES -



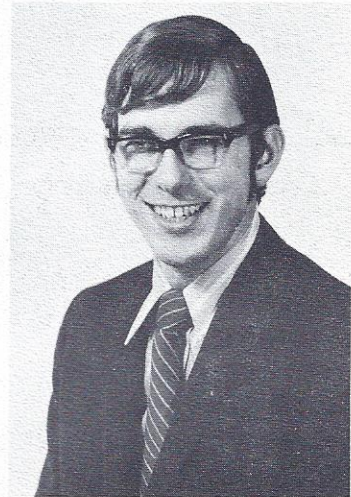

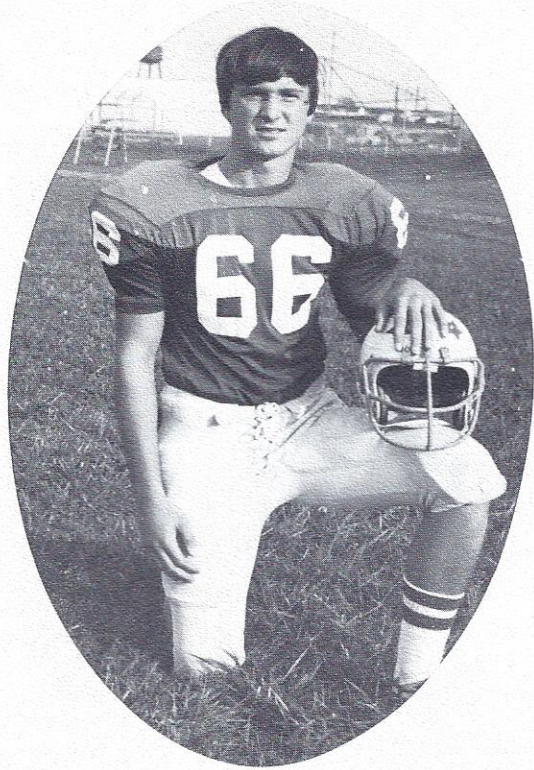
This is a first. During the month of November there was not a single job-related illness or accident reported to the First Aid Department that required doctor attention.

Thank you, one and all.

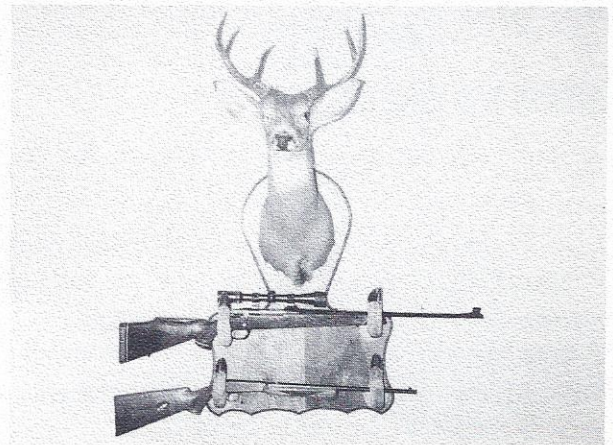
