

Medical News

How valuable is SIGHT? Cataracts are the greatest single cause of blindness a mong adults today.

Cataract is not an infection...is not contagious...is not a skin growing over the eye. A cataract is an opacity in the crystalline lens of the eye or of its capsule, which prevents light from passing through. The lens refracts the light which passes through it and relays the light to the retina which is the nerve tissue in the back of the eye. When activated, the retina passes the message on to the brain. THIS IS SIGHT. A cataract prevents light passing through the lens and thus, the retina is not activated. The cataract causes swelling of the eye fibers which then cause a distorted image to appear.


Most cataracts are in older persons but can occur after an injury or a blow to

the eye. Cataracts may also be caused by heat, Xray treatment, or the ingestion of certain toxic substances or drugs. Some may be due to nutritional or inflammatory disturbances in the eye and may follow other conditions such as, glaucoma. Cataracts are diagnosed by ophthalmoscopic examination of the dilated pupil. The only treatment for cataracts is surgical removal of the lens, permitting the light to come into the eye unobstructed. No glasses, diets, salves, drops, medicines, or treatments, can prevent or cure cataracts. Cataract surgery today is successful in 95% to 97% of the operations.

Free clinics are offered at various times of the year through-out our city pertaining to glaucoma, blood pressure, kidney disease, and diabetes. Watch your newspaper for dates and places. The Life and Sight you save might be your own.




